#### **SECTION 4 FIRST AID MEASURERS**

Eyes: Flush eyes with water while lifting the upper and lower lids. Get medical attention if irritation persists.

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#### **SECTION 11 TOXICOLOGICAL INFORMATION**

However, the titanium dioxide in this product is bound in the polymer matrix and dust exposure would not be expected. None of the other components present at 0.1% or greater are listed as a carcinogen by NTP, IARC, ACGIH or OSHA.
